Carrying the Province the extra mile....

In the final fund-raising challenge for the Festival 2024, a team from within the Province will be taking on the Staffordshire 3 Peaks Challenge – a distance of 18 miles in under 8 hours with more than 2,800 feet of ascent. However, in a twist to this already difficult challenge, the walking team will carry the equivalent weight of the Festival 2024 Executive and therefore



the weight of the Province 'that extra mile' to raise vital funds for the Festival Appeal.

The walkers from across the Province will be assisted by a support team who will be relaying messages and progress live via the dedicated Facebook page and the Provincial website.

The Challenge is to complete the circular route meaning the team will each be walking the entire distance linking each of the three peaks before completing the circuit. This is not a relay. Each member will carry their share of the additional weight to their standard payloads for spending a day in the Peak District.

The date for the Challenge is set for Saturday 27th July 2024 to enable the donations to be added to the final total raised for the Festival in time for the Gala Dinner.

A Special evening at Queeselet-St James' Lodge No.6887

At the regular meeting of Queeselet-St James' Lodge No.6887 on Tuesday 9th April 2024 at the Yenton Masonic Centre, Erdington Birmingham, the brethren came together with many distinguished guests and friends to celebrate with W Bro John Samuel Matthews his 50 years in Freemasonry.

The visitors included RW Bros J Lockley PGM, T D C Lloyd PPGM, J Derry AsstProvGM, V W Bros P P Manning PGSwdB PDPGM(Warks), J A E Winter PGSwdB, R A Stubbs PGSwdB, P E M Parsons PJGD, J M Phenix PDepGSwdB, J D Harris PAGDC. Also, many active provincial officers including W Bros R P Archer Prov SGW, M J Sewell Prov JGW, P Bailey Prov SGD, B C Turner-Farmer Prov AGDC, M Sedden Prov GStdB, and many, many friends.

The Lodge was opened and subsequently called off by the Worshipful Master W. Bro Mathew S. Shaw, the Provincial Grand Master asked for chairs to be placed on the Lodge floor, he then invited the Immediate Past Master, W Bro Matthews to join him and both were escorted and seated in the middle of the Lodge room.



There then followed an informal "This is Your Life" conversation. This included a very interesting discussion where Bro John spoke about his early life and schooling history, also his professional life as a Structural Engineer. Bro John referred to the many highlights of his varied career which included several anecdotal instances which resulted in humorous recollections much to the amusement of the brethren present.

Bro John left school late in 1959 and immediately started work as a trainee Structural Engineer with a consulting engineering practice in Birmingham, but within 10 years, together with a colleague they established their own engineering consultancy. The company expanded after a series of acquisitions and mergers, with a staff compliment of over 50 and offices in Birmingham, London and Manchester. But, after 30 years for various reasons John resigned in 1999 but returned to work in 2001 for a large international company, becoming a Director of Engineering until his retirement in 2008. A truly remarkable career spanning 48 years for a teenager who had failed his GCSE's.

The PGM discussed with Bro John his Masonic history and his notable achievements, John was proposed and initiated into Queeselet Lodge meeting at Wretham Rd, Handsworth, Birmingham in 1974 becoming Worshipful Master in 1986. He served as Lodge Secretary for three separate periods over the years, returning to the Master's chair in October 2005 and then again in 2020.

At the conclusion of this the PGM congratulated W Bro Matthews for his committed and loyal service during his 50 years in Freemasonry and requested that the Prov AGDC, W Bro B C Turner-Farmer, read aloud the wording of the Certificate before the PGM formally presented it.

W Bro Matthews was most grateful and thanked the PGM and all the brethren present, stating that he would treasure the certificate as a reminder of this auspicious occasion.

Here was a station which played the music I'd grown up with, commercial free and without the usual clutter of news, travel etc etc. Might I fit in?

Long story short, I joined them at the beginning of 2023 to present a weekday programme between 10am and 12 noon. They haven't sacked me yet, so I guess I'm doing something right!

The biggest change since the first part of my broadcasting career is the fact that I no longer need to travel to

a studio to present "live". I now work from the comfort of my office at home, equipped with only a microphone, headphones and an internet connection - plus the ability to speak!

Like my Masonry, I enjoy being part of the broadcasting world and continue to delight in bringing great music to our audience. It also proves that just when you thought one door was closed, another one opens!

On joining Hospital Radio Stafford, which, over fifty years later is still going strong, I discovered that I had a skill which transformed my life for the next 25 years. As well as working in a "proper" job and starting a business, I produced and presented music programmes at radio stations across the Midlands. Some of them you may recall. BBC Stoke, Beacon Radio, Mercia Sound, Signal Radio and latterly WABC, an oldies station based in Wolverhampton.

Then, in 1997, the accountants took over. They took away the "local" element from radio stations they acquired and centralised

Julia was unfortunately taken ill in 2023 but has since returned to the work she so enjoys, and the salon continues to thrive helping the community offering support and help in learning. The brethren of Gordon Lodge No. 2149 who meet at Shelton Masonic Hall, were pleased to support the charity and proud father, Bro. Smith was able to present a cheque to his daughter Julia and the charity.

Everyday, people face difficult circumstances, they battle with bereavement. breakdowns, poverty, mental health, childcare responsibilities, illness, lack of confidence and learning barriers that prevent them from engaging in employment or education.
