Staffordshire Freemasons Remembrance Day Service.







On Friday 12th November the Head of Staffordshire Freemasons, John Lockley, together with his Deputy, David Thomas and Assistants Mike Santopietro and John Derry, accompanied by the



Head of Royal Arch Masonry in Staffordshire, Robin Stubbs and other members of the Province some with their wives and partners attended the Masonic Memorial Garden at the National Memorial Arboretum near Burton-upon-Trent for a remembrance service for the fallen of two World Wars and other conflicts.

The Provincial remembrance service was led by the Reverend Edward Haycock, Provincial Grand Chaplain. John Lockley then laid a wreath on behalf of all freemasons in Staffordshire.

Churnet Valley Lodge No. 8092 W. Bro. Donald (Don) James Stockton P.Pr.S.G.W

The Provincial Grand Master Rt. W. Bro. John Lockley together with several brethren from Churnet Valley Lodge NO. 8092 recently attended the home address of W. Bro. Donald J. Stockton to present him with a 50-year certificate to celebrate the anniversary of his initiation into the Lodge but also to promote him to P.Pr.S.G.W.

Brother 'Don' Stockton was initiated into Churnet Valley Lodge No. 8092 on 1st November 1971, Passed to the Second Degree on 7th February 1972 and Raised in December of that year; he was awarded Provincial Honours in 1990. Don was one of a strong cadre of police officers who brought a special flavour to the Lodge. His gentle, whimsical nature brought an air of calm to the Lodge which seemed at odds with his undeniably powerful physique and presence. Over the years he was to become one of the most respected and best liked members of the Lodge and proved himself to be a most sincere and dedicated Freemason.

Don was a largely, self-taught musician whose mellow singing graced many festive boards and if the technological idiosyncrasies of the organ occasionally outwitted him the musical contribution he made to Lodge ceremonies was much appreciated and added to the beauty and solemnity of the meetings. As a Past Master his interest in and enthusiasm for Freemasonry never wavered. Regardless of the weather Don was a regular at any Lodge occasion where his succinct and penetrating comments were highly valued. He was always ready to stand in at short notice if the team was an officer short and made the explanation of the Second-Degree Tracing Board his very own, delivering it with fluency, sincerity, clarity and understanding.

His great concern has always been the charitable endeavours of the Lodge particularly in those peripheral fields where the Craft does so much work that goes unnoticed. Don could always be relied upon to remind the Treasurer and Secretary when donations were due or to bring before the Lodge Committee some project which he considered worthy of consideration.

Just as each Lodge will shape and reward its members, so the members leave something

of themselves within the ethos of the Lodge. The legacy of Don's fifty years in Masonry is plain to see in the good fellowship that permeates Lodge meetings and in the calm resilience with which it faces challenges. Don's fifty years in Freemasonry have been marked by a quiet, self effacing, total commitment to its service and its ideals: the Craft can ask no more.





Dieu-La-Cresse Lodge No: 4169

On Monday 8th November 2021, the Provincial Grand Master Rt. W. Bro. John Lockley together with several Provincial officers attended Dieu-La-Cresse Lodge at Leek Masonic Hall to finally celebrate with the members and guests the centenary of the Lodge. The centenary was originally due to be held in November 2020, but due to the Covid Pandemic like most events and functions everything was placed on hold.

The Dieu-La-Cresse consecration meeting was held at 3.30pm on Saturday 2nd October 1920 at Leek Town Hall, followed by the Festive Board at the Black Swan Inn, Leek. The idea of a second Lodge at Leek is to be found in the minutes of St Edwards Lodge No: 966, their Worshipful Master at the time being W. Bro Chell. A petition was drawn up to form a new lodge and in May 1920, brethren from St Edwards Lodge signed a petition and Lord Dartmouth the Provincial Grand Master duly signed the recommendation.



At that time Leek was a very prosperous mill town and St Edwards Lodge had found that they had too many members, most being mill owners and Dieu-La-Cresse was thought to have been a Lodge for the mill workers. This is why, we have always met at 6.45pm in the evening, one of the latest meeting times in the Province. This allowed the workers time to go home, change out of their work clothes and attend the Lodge.

The name Dieu-La-Cresse comes from the Cistercian Abbey which was built in 1214 and located on the outskirts of Leek, the name in Norman French means "May God Prosper it". The abbey, which was connected with St Edwards Church, was destroyed in 1538 by Henry VIII during the dissolution of the monasteries.

The sixty brethren that attended the celebration, included a full Provincial visit led by the Provincial Grand Master, the two Assistant Provincial Grand Masters, and a full contingent of acting Provincial officers. The centenary warrant was read by the Provincial Grand Secretary W. Bro. Dr Mathew Gibbons and following inspection by the Provincial Grand Master, it was presented to our Worshipful Master W. Bro. Malcolm Barlow. We were then presented with a 100-year certificate from Province by W. Bro. Michele Santopietro who commented that in the early days of his Freemasonry, Dieu-La-Cresse was his second home!

Also, that evening the Provincial Grand Master presented three Grand Lodge Certificates to Master Masons of the Lodge. The Lodge, which only has six active Past Masters has held several Emergency meetings recently and has a substantial number of brethren wearing light blue. This is unusual for a Lodge of our age but really encouraging, we also have candidates waiting.

A very enjoyable evening was had by all, both in the Lodge and at the Festive Board which was held at Westwood Golf Club due to the large numbers attending.

Whilst I was trying to compile this Lodge history, I was constantly being wished luck from brethren from beyond the grave! In a number of documents, I found the brethren referred to the 100-year celebration as far back as 50 years ago, wishing the Brother who would compile the history all the best of luck, as I do to the Brother who hopefully will compile our 200 year history!

W. Bro. William Henry Stanley P.Pr.S.G.W.

After a delay caused by the pandemic,

W. Bro Bill Stanley was finally presented with a Certificate celebrating his 50-years in Freemasonry in a ceremony at the November meeting of St. Giles Lodge No: 1587. The special evening started with well-rehearsed initiation ceremony for the candidate Russell Andrzejewski, who was welcomed into the craft.



The certificate was then presented to Bill by Assistant Provincial Grand Master W. Bro. John Derry PJGD after W. Bro. John S. Ratcliffe gave a resume of Bill, of how they first met in Round Table and his initiation into Freemasonry.

Bill, like many other Freemasons was a member of Round Table and was very active in both Cheadle and other Round Tables in the area. He attended many meetings late into the evening, which was quite difficult and tiring, considering his working day on the farm in Blurton started very early.

In December 1969, another Round Table member, Eric Hodgkinson proposed Bill in St Giles Lodge, Stanley Keates another Tabler seconded him, and Bill was initiated on Wednesday 23 September 1970. He was Passed in the December and Raised the following March.

Bill progressed through the lodge offices and became Worshipful Master in 1985, learning the ritual whilst milking his cows, it was said even his cows stepped off with the left foot! Bill continued to be active in the lodge returning to the chair as WM in 2001, then Tyler, Chaplain and Almoner in 2013 retaining that role to date.

In Provincial Grand Lodge Bill was appointed an active rank in 1991 as Assistant Grand Director of Ceremonies, in 1998 P.Pr.S.G.D, in 2008 P.Pr.J.G.W. and in 2017 P.Pr.S.G.W.

A most enjoyable evening was had by all who attended.

Robert Mummery Lodge No: 8331 W. Bro. James H Rowley

The newer, much younger brethren within the Lodge just know Jim as the kind, friendly organist who is seated in the corner entertaining the meetings with his music, but this is a far cry from the real story.

Robert Mummery Lodge, came about as the result of several Warwickshire Masons from Mozart Lodge, also Chase and St Augustines Lodges wishing to start a Lodge closer to home. These worthy brothers, included the Beniston Brothers; Frank and Aubrey and their brother in law Harold Weaver, were all Jim's family as he is married to the lovely Nadia, Frank's

daughter and the sister of Derek Beniston, also a Past Master of both Mozart and Robert Mummery Lodge.

When Robert Mummery Lodge was formed Jim should have been the very first initiate but owing to another Brothers' availablity problems, he stood down to allow the other Brother to take that privilege, a sure sign of the man. Bro. Jim was proposed by his father in law W. Bro. Frank Beniston and seconded by W. Bro. Aubrey Beniston, he was initiated by Frank on Monday the 9th November 1970, but sadly Frank passed away shortly afterwards.

Jim having progressed through the degrees, he was passed in April 1971, raised in March 1972, and then progressed through all the offices of the Lodge, until he was finally installed by W. Bro. George Griffiths as master of the Robert Mummery Lodge on Monday 15th October 1979.

Bro. Jim was a truly wonderful ritualist and later with Bro. George Griffiths, became the preceptor of the Lodge for many years teaching the younger brethren Masonic etiquette and ritual, his skills as a headmaster certainly came to the fore. Also, as the Charity Steward for a number of years he helped raise Lodge charity funds.

Jim has given so much to Robert Mummery Lodge and Masonary in general over the last 50 years, in the giving of his

W. Bro. Michael Robin Bartlett P.Pr.S.G.W.

The 600th meeting of Barr Beacon Lodge held on Tuesday 2nd November 2021, was special for a number of reasons, predominantly the presentation of a 50-year certificate to W.Bro. Michael Robin Bartlett P.Pr.S.G.W. by the Provincial Grand Master Rt.W.Bro. John Lockley, to celebrate the anniversary of his initiation into the Lodge.

W.Bro. Bartlett, affectionately known to all as Robin, which his mother insisted on calling him was initiated into Freemasonry and Barr Beacon Lodge No. 6109 in particular on Tuesday 2nd November 1971. This was the 193rd regular meeting, at a ceremony held at the former Masonic Hall in Freer Street, Walsall. The subscriptions to the Lodge at that time were 20 Guinea's (£21) !

Bro. Robin was the last member of the Lodge to be initiated at Freer Street before



it was demolished and the Lodge moved initially to Wednesbury and subsequently to the newly built rooms at the Masonic Hall at Aldridge. Bro. Robin became a Fellow Craft on 7th March 1972 and Master Mason on 2nd January 1973.



Bro. Robin became Master of the Lodge in October 1983. The Provincial Grand Master was at that time was W.Bro. Stanley Barrington, who presided at the meeting. Bro. Robin also took over the Mastership of the Lodge in 1985 when the installed Master, W.Bro. Wall sadly passed away just after his Installation.

Over the years Bro. Robin has received Provincial honours including first as a Steward, then subsequently, P.Pr.S.D., P.Pr.J.G.W. and in October 2012, was promoted to P.Pr.S.G.W. by W.Bro. Gary Read who was the Deputy Provincial Grand Master at the time.

Since 2001 Robin has been the very hard working a generous Almoner of the Lodge. He has cared for the widows of Lodge members over the past 20 years and has generously supported Lodge membérs ' who have been ill or hospitalised over all of that time. He has also donated funds regularly to non-masonic charitable organisations on behalf of the Lodge.

Bro Robin has been involved in the Lodge workings over all his years in Barr Beacon Lodge, not least was the detailed work he carried out on the two Lodge history booklets. First was the 50 years booklet detailing the years 1945 to 1995, and the second booklet covering the further ten years to 2005. So Bro. Robin it appears may have some further work to undertake soon....

Bro. Robin is the "Elder Statesman" of Barr Beacon lodge and we as members thank him for his exceptional work and generousity of the past 50 years. We wish him and his lovely wife Barbara health and happiness for the future.

Also at this meeting Barr Beacon were able to conduct an Initation ceremony for their newest member, Bro. Martin Smith who was welcomed into the Craft in exceptional style.

The meeting was also a special occasion for W. Bro. Jock Planck P.Pr.J.G.W. of Barr Beacon Lodge, W. Bro. Dave Davies P.Pr.J.G.W. of Gnosall St. Lawrence Lodge No. 9458 and myself, W. Bro. Chris Hill P.Pr.J.G.W., as we were able to meet up and talk of old times, all of us having been initiated into Kano Lodge No. 4975 in the District Grand Lodge of Nigeria during the 1970's.



Kano Lodge 4975 was situated in the second largest city in Nigeria, Kano. The City is close to the southern edge of the Sahara desert and and 800 miles from the coast and former capital city of Lagos, therefore has a climate of high, dry temperatures and a short rainy season. Unfortunately, Kano Lodge is no longer in existance having lost it's original building and temple during a government purge



DISTRICT GRAND LODGE OF NIGERIA Under The United Grand Lodge of England in the late 1980's. It subsequently had to return it's warrant to United Grand Lodge in 2007.

Unlike the UK where Lodges operate under the auspices of a Provincial Grand Lodge, overseas Lodges operate under Districts. The District Grand Lodge of Nigeria was established in 1913 although there is documentary evidence that English Freemasonry was introduced in Nigeria as far back as 1861. Today the District has 41 Lodges under its wing with over 1,000 members, administered in 6 masonic areas each headed by an Assistant District Grand Master reporting to the Rt. W. District Grand Master Dr. Onyechi Ikpeazu SAN OON.

The District has over the years supported
