Masonic Halls

Throughout the difficult time of the Covid Pandemic and lockdown the Masonic Hall Companies within the Province have taken the opportunity to review their business practice and their facilities.

Walsall Masonic Company have updated technology making it easier for the brethren and the public using their facilities at Aldridge. They kept in mind that whilst the Company were not generating much business any project undertaken had to provide significant benefits to all. They have introduced a new communications system, upgraded to 5G Wi-Fi, also purchased new cash registers and obtained new touch and go card machines, all to assist and make transactions and stock control far easier. Unfortunately, though due to storm damage the function rooms and practice temple needed to be redecorated and so as business slowly comes back to the new normal general maintenance resumes.

Handsworth Masonic Hall have

reported there has been extensive repair, refurbishment and improvement at the Wretham Rd site. This includes extensive electrical work, replacing circuits and new LED lighting. A new intruder alarm and updated fire alarm

system were fitted, together with a new, more secure door entry system with key fob access. The building has had extensive plastering work throughout and many rooms redecorated, also major refurbishment of the kitchen area has taken place any many new appliances purchased. The building itself has not been neglected either, with several additional external security lights, new guttering, and a new emergency door fitted with easy access for wheelchair use. The Chair of Directors W. Bro. John Williams P.Pr.J.G.W. (Warks) also reports that the work hasn't stopped there, with a new £26k lift to be fitted soon.

Hanley Masonic Hall have unfortunately suffered several break-ins resulting in wanton damage and so it was decided to purchase a bespoke set of security grills. which blend in well with the building in Shelton and are hardly noticeable from the inside. There has also been considerable investment in the central heating system which is an ongoing project. And finally, after months of planning to allow greater access for those with mobility issues and with contributions from several Lodges. Chapters. Associated Orders and individuals work got under way on the lift. There were many setbacks including parts needing to be manufactured, but the lift is now finally fitted and working. W. Bro. Ken Bell P.Pr.J.G.W. of Ceramic Lodge No: 3827 took on the task of ensuring that the new panelling that needed to be fitted would be done so in an unobtrusive manner so that it complimented, the existing structure. Bro Ken worked tirelessly to fit the panelling and to stain it to the same colour as the





original panels and in doing so he has succeeded in providing the hall with an asset that should last for many years to come. Bro Ken overcame numerous issues regarding the fitment of the panels and in doing so had to overcome personal health problems, but to his enduring credit he persevered, and the outcome is of a very high standard. As an expression of appreciation from the Shelton Executive and Members the P.S.G.W. W. Bro. Ralph Ritchey presented Bro. Ken with a bottle of his favourite tipple as well as some gift vouchers.

W. Bro Beverley John Nicholls P.Prov.S.G.W, Celebration of 60 years in Craft Freemasonry

On Friday 14th January 2022 Round Table Lodge No. 8273 who meet at Wednesbury were delighted to receive the Past Provincial Grand Master RW Bro Thomas D. C. Lloyd OBE TD DL to present a Provincial Certificate on the celebration of W. Bro Beverley John Nicholls's achievement of 60 years membership of Craft Freemasonry.

The meeting was well attended but if it were not for Covid, the anniversary of this milestone would have undoubtedly attracted a significantly greater attendance. The lodge Treasurer W. Bro Roger R Boak, commenced the presentation with a splendid eloquent tribute and personal history of Bro Bev.

Bev was born on Saturday 2nd November 1935; his father was a well-known sprinter and played for Walsall FC. He has lived in Walsall all his life; was schooled in Walsall and went on to Commercial College prior to joining the family business J & H Nicholls Paints, which he ran successfully after his father retired. Bev was also a director of other companies including Nicholls Hennesy Hotels, he was influenced by and took inspiration from his uncle Lord Harmer-Nicholls, Baronet of Darlaston.

It was whilst a member of Walsall Round Table No: 71 in Area 5 that Bev's personal life had a seismic shift. Walsall was twinned with Mulhouse, which is close to the Swiss-German border and the Round Tables had exchange visits which Bev regularly attended, often with his fellow Tabler and close friend Chris Butler. Bev at this stage was a confirmed bachelor and on one of these visits Bev was persuaded to extend his stay and visit the Black Forest in Germany. It was there that he met a teacher called Ursula Marianne and was totally smitten. The rest as they say is history. Bev and Ule as she is known, married and have two lovely daughters Cherry & Charlotte.

Bev was introduced to Freemasonry by his uncle, Lord Harmer-Nicholls, a qualified barrister who was also born and educated locally. Bev was initiated into The Lodge of St John No: 6320 at Wolverhampton on 25th January 1961. Whilst a member there he joined a team to establish a new masonic lodge to be called Round Table Lodge No. 8273 and was of course a founder member.

On Monday 5th May 1969 Round Table Lodge 8273 was duly consecrated by the W. Bro H Wilson Keys the Provincial Grand Master and his team. W. Bro Noel Boardman was installed as Worshipful Master and invested his Wardens and the rest of his officers. Bro Bev was invested as a Steward of the Lodge and there followed a consecration banquet at which 137 brethren dined.

Bro Bev progressed through the lodge and was installed as Master in 1975 and had an extremely busy year in the chair. In November 1987 to Mark the 100th meeting of the lodge Bro Bev and the late W. Bro Mike Barratt presented to the lodge two handsome kneeling stools, which are still in use today.

Bev has many interests away from Freemasonry, he has always been a keen golfer and in fact resides near to Walsall Golf Club, where he is a member and in 1983 was Captain and duly became a Trustee. He regularly appeared on the honours boards after winning many competitions and was a feared opponent in match play.

In June 1971 the first lodge golf meeting was held at Walsall Golf Club, which not surprisingly was won by Bro Bev. He also represented the lodge in the Provincial Grand Masters Annual Golf Trophy Competition: -winning it in 2012.

Bro Boak commented on how Bev has always had a great wit with a dry sense of humour, a good dinner guest and always impeccably dressed. How he likes tradition and that he is not interested in material things or life's trappings. That Bev is a constant source of quiet understated encouragement and a true inspiration to both new masons and established masons alike.

RW Bro Lloyd was more than pleased to continue the presentation and commented how personally satisfying it was for him to attend and make the presentation, firstly he detailed Bro Bev's masonic history from his initiation in The Lodge of St John to membership of Round Table Lodge. Also, his Provincial promotions from P.G.Stwd, in 1982 to P.Pr.S.G.W. in 2011 and his membership of other Orders including The Holy Royal Arch and Rose Croix.



Also, how Bev had served the Lodge in all its offices and still conscientiously continues to do so, having now been its Chaplain for 10 years. He congratulated Bro Bev and thanked him for his contribution over the many years, to Freemasonry in general, to the Province of Staffordshire, and especially to Round Table Lodge.

He described Bev as a quiet private man who had set an exemplary standard to emulate, generating the respect of the brethren and how over 60 years of unstinting service this had beneficially influenced brethren of every rank. RW Bro Lloyd stated how proud, honoured and privileged he felt, and he asked the Provincial Director of Ceremonies to read the certificate before presenting it. Bro Bev thanked everyone and all the brethren present had a most enjoyable evening.

W. Bro. Jack Roper Yates P.Prov.S.G.W Celebration of 60 years in Craft Freemasonry

On Wednesday 26th January 2022 the Assistant Provincial Grand Master W. Bro Michele Santopietro PJGD attended Smithchild Lodge No. 2064 who meet at Hanley Masonic Hall. This was to celebrate with the lodge and to present a Provincial Certificate to W. Bro Jack Yates on his achievement of 60 years membership in Craft Freemasonry.

In the lodge the certificate was read by the attending Director of Ceremonies before being formally presented to Bro Jack, who thanked all the brethren present. W. Bro Anthony Dejak P.Pr.G.Sup.Wks. commented at the festive board how honoured he felt to be able to say a few words on behalf of the lodge and propose a toast to Bro Jack, who unfortunately is currently undergoing treatment for ultraviolet light damage to his face.

Bro Jack was born on Friday 21st June 1935 to Jack & Beatrice Yates, in Preston Lancashire. His father, Jack Snr was a Passed Fireman at Preston Motive Power Department of the London Midland & Scottish Railways and his Mother Beatrice was a secretary in a local solicitors office.



Jack Snr was also an active Freemason having been initiated into Coppull Lodge No. 4232 in the Province of West Lancashire in January 1927. But, when the Second World War broke out, he could no longer attend his Lodge due to the Government travel restrictions. After several promotions at work, he moved to Crewe where he met two members of Smithchild Lodge, Bro Ernie Farley and Bro Cecil Mason, thus

beginning the connection with the Lodge which Jack Jnr subsequently joined.

After leaving school in 1952 Bro Jack followed in his father's footsteps by going into the railway and duly started an engineering apprenticeship at the Crewe Works, whilst also studying for his technical qualifications and A levels. Jack completed his apprenticeship but continued his studies at the Queen Mary College, London University, where, in 1959, he graduated with a first-class honours degree in Mechanical Engineering. John Yates who with his wife Kerry Joanne has provided them with 2 grandchildren Joshua Jack aged 16 and Tobius James aged 13.

Bro Jack took early retirement in September 1990 and shortly after joined Probus Club in Nantwich where he became Club President for the year 2003 / 2004. Retirement has also enabled Bro Jack to further his hobbies which include watercolour painting, gardening and until his eyesight deteriorated, steam locomotive model engineering.

The 50's saw an incredible amount of change within the Railway industry with new forms of traction, such as electric and diesel being introduced. Jack was keen to understand these new forms of traction and in order to gain suitable experience, his job required him to move to various parts of the country, including Crewe, Derby and eventually London, where he became Personal Assistant to the Chief Mechanical Engineer.

It was during this time that Jack met his lovely wife, Margaret. Margaret was based in Derby and Jacks keen interest in diesel traction bought him back to Derby where he and Margaret married on 10th November 1973 at Darley Abbey Methodist Church. They were blessed in 1974 with the birth of their son, Stephen May that year, eventually taking the Chair of King Solomon in October 1970 and receiving his first Provincial promotion in 1975.

The brethren warmly toasted Bro Jack who was then presented with special bottle of whisky to commemorate the evening. A most enjoyable evening was had by all.
